

Student code of conduct Google Classroom live stream

Google Classroom (GC) live stream is an excellent opportunity to aid positive interaction between students and their teacher centred on knowledge acquisition and reinforcement.

Teachers will inform their class of when they will be available for a 'live stream' 30 minute session. Ideally, students would be doing the lesson from home whilst simultaneously asking the questions to the teacher about the lesson. Alternatively, teachers could set aside a time at a different time of the week where they could be available.

The following 'live stream code of conduct' sets out the school's clear expectations on students' conduct when using GC live stream. It is important students read this code of conduct carefully to understand how they should conduct themselves when interacting with their teachers. Misuse of GC live stream will not be tolerated and is a breach of this code of conduct resulting in future interaction through GC live stream being withdrawn.

GC live stream will only be available at the times set out by teachers. Teachers will turn on 'students can post and comment' prior to their GC live stream. On its conclusion teachers will turn off 'students can post and comment', enabling 'only teachers can post or comment'.

The facility for students to make contact and interact with their teachers through GC live stream is both a positive experience and, importantly, a valuable means to ask questions, dispel misconceptions and reinforce their knowledge and understanding, therefore if used appropriately a rewarding experience for students.

Code of conduct:

- Students must only use GC live stream to post appropriate comments relevant to their teachers' voiceover/visualiser presentation or issued work.
- Inappropriate comments relate to anything that is not directly related to the subject topic, for example attempts by students to communicate with one another, irrelevant comments not directly associated to the subject nor directed to the teacher, comments of a 'social' basis typically communicated from one student to another and inappropriate comments and language which may cause offence.
- Students' comments which are not relevant to the subject matter will be immediately responded to by the teacher. Students will be removed from the live stream and the live stream may be terminated.
- Students who misuse GC live stream may be banned from future participation, with subject leader, progress leader and parents and carers informed.

This code of conduct will take effect from Monday 29th June 2020.
