Testing and contact tracing in schools and colleges over the Easter holidays

Following the success of the asymptomatic testing programme on the return to school and college, it is vital to keep testing at home throughout the Easter holidays and into the summer term. Students with consent will be issued with a test kit today containing 7 tests which should be used over the two week holiday period.

Students should:

- continue to test twice a week at home (all those who are able to)
- report positive, negative or void results using the NHS portal <u>https://www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result</u> as well as via Sharepoint
- test before returning to school for the summer term, either the night before, or morning of, the first day back to find and isolate any positive cases

For the purposes of contact tracing staff, students, parents and carers need **only inform the school of a positive case if the symptoms develop within 2 days of being in school (up to and including Saturday 2nd April) or they have tested positive with a lateral flow device (LFD) test (and will subsequently need to book a confirmatory PCR test).**

The school will then contact you and ask you to assist in identifying close contacts so that the school can advise others regarding self-isolation, as the student may have been infectious whilst in school. If symptoms develop after 2nd April, you do not need to inform the school. All positive tests should be reported by email on PositiveTest@highamlaneschool.co.uk

Where pupils, students or staff test positive for coronavirus (COVID-19) during the holidays using an LFD test more than 2 days since being in school, they will only need to inform the school if they will still be self-isolating when school returns on Tuesday 20th April. Staff, students, parents and carers should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.

Support Pack for Parents on Anxiety

Anxiety is a feeling that children may experience which can cause worry or fear. This can be a combination of physical sensations, thoughts and feelings. All children can feel worried, and this is a normal part of growing up. At certain points, such as starting a new school or staying somewhere new, children may become more worried, but will normally be able to calm down quite quickly with or without support. Anxiety can become more of an issue when a child feels over-whelmed or distressed by their feelings and find their thoughts unmanageable. If this continues over a long period of time, they may begin to feel sad, depressed, exhausted or isolated, and this may affect their day-to-day routines. Providing early support can stop anxiety becoming an issue which affects them day to day.

SIXTH FORM (YEAR 12)

Bursaries at Warwick University for Disadvantaged Students

Warwick Scholar are offering bursaries of up to £2,000 per year of study for students applying to Warwick University who meet the following criteria:

Applicants must meet all of the following criteria:

- Attend a school or college, or live, within one of the local authority areas (Coventry, Warwickshire, Birmingham, Solihull, Sandwell, Dudley, Wolverhampton, Walsall, Staffordshire, Worcestershire, Northamptonshire, Leicestershire, Leicester)
- Have Home UK fee status or will have it by the time they enter university
- Have achieved at least 5 grades 9-6 (A*-B) at GCSE (or equivalent); if this does not include English Language and Mathematics, they must have achieved at least a grade 4 (C) in these subjects
- Meet all of the qualification and subject requirements of the course they are applying for, as outlined on the University's website (e.g. be studying the correct A levels and have achieved any required GCSEs).
- Additional Criteria

Applicants must meet at least two of the following criteria (unless they have experience of local authority care, as outlined below), and priority will be given to those meeting multiple criteria:

- In receipt of, or has within the last six years been eligible for, free school meals
- Will be the first generation of their family to attend university (not including siblings)
- Completed Key Stage 4 Studies at and/or currently attend a priority school (details on website)
- Live in a priority neighbourhood (details on website)
- Has experienced significant extenuating circumstances that have had (or are having) a detrimental
 effect on academic attainment e.g. is a young carer, has suffered from long term illness requiring
 time out of education, has a disability or specific learning difficulty

If either of the following statements apply to them, their application will be prioritised:

- · Have spent a minimum of three months in local authority care
- Are currently resident in a foyer or other supported accommodation
