Our Services

Warwickshire Music provides a wide range of services to support your student and staff needs. Ranging from instrumental and vocal lessons in individual, group and whole class settings to curriculum support, Music Technology, Music Therapy, Vocal programmes, Instrumental hire, CPD and administrative support. All delivered by a dedicated team of highly skilled professionals.

The information below provides an overview of our programme of services followed by details about and links to organise your programme for the 2021-2022 academic year.

Up Beat – First Access Learning

Whole class ensemble teaching to begin your student's musical learning journey as a whole class group!

Cost: £1050 per year including instruments (one hour delivery per week, up to 36 weeks)

Due to demand a maximum of 2 hours of subsidised UpBeat is available per school, early booking is therefore essential.

Instrumental and Vocal Teaching

Arranged in individual or group lesson settings of your choice to meet the needs of your students and school.

Lessons available on all orchestral instruments, voice, guitar, keyboard, drums and percussion.

Cost: £40 per hour (33 weeks of delivery)

Minimum of one hour delivery per week per teacher provided is required.

Ensemble Teaching and Direction

'Playtastic' - School Ensembles

Enable your students to benefit from and perform in a school-based ensemble opportunity each week led by one of our experienced members of staff.

World Music Groups/Ensembles

Enable your students to learn and perform as a Samba, Djembe or Steel Pan group each week using instruments

provided by Warwickshire Music at no additional charge.

Cost: £40 per hour (33 weeks of delivery)

Minimum of one hour delivery per week per teacher provided is required.

Primary Phase Curriculum Support

Warwickshire Music specialist teachers can plan and deliver your primary music curriculum each week.

Cost: £50 per hour (up to 38 weeks of delivery)

Minimum of one hour delivery per week per teacher provided is required.

Music Technology Supporting the Curriculum

Our specialist music technology teachers' can provide bespoke training and support to build your teachers technology skills or plan and deliver music technology workshops to work with your students to enhance your music curriculum. ICT equipment can also be hired to support our work in your school.
