Free BT Wi-Fi vouchers

To support families who currently don't have adequate access to internet connectivity, we have been given a limited number of free Wi-Fi Hotspot logins from BT from now until the end of July. Due to limited numbers they will be distributed on a first-come, first-served basis with priority given to disadvantaged students.

How does it work?

If you're having trouble connecting or maintaining an internet connection:

- Check you receive sufficient BT Hotspot Wi-Fi coverage at your address. Click on BT's Wi-Fi hotspot checker - <u>https://www.btwifi.com/find/</u>
- Carrying out this check is really important to avoid disappointment this solution won't work for everyone. Please don't contact us if, unfortunately, you're unable to secure strong enough coverage.
- 3. If coverage is sufficiently strong please email the school <u>contactus@highamlaneschool.co.uk</u> to let us know who the voucher is for (name and form). Please Note: One voucher allocated to one student.
- 4. Safer Internet Day – Tuesday 9 February 2021

At Higham Lane we are proud to celebrate this day by reminding ourselves what an amazing space the internet can be and the importance to us all using it in a safe and secure way.

In this most uncertain of times and when your son/daughter's education is through remote learning, we need to pause for one moment and think about their screen time. We also need to think about what we are doing online more generally and how this may affect us.

As parents/carers let's remember that children may feel confused, angry and upset with what they see online, often believing what they read or watch. It's important to remind children that images and videos are often edited; influencers and celebrities get paid for promotion because of their large numbers of followers; news can sometimes be fake and they may be experiencing targeted advertising and sponsored content.

It's also important to remember to be app aware - have parental controls in place, keep on top of gaming hours, have safe search engine settings, try to be social media savvy and follow up on any concerns you

may have. A really useful way of doing this is to <u>start with a conversation about the internet</u>, establish online rules as a family and share devices together.

Think about the 4 C's of the internet – Content – what are they being exposed to? Contact – Who are they talking to? Conduct – is their behaviour online appropriate? Commercialism – Pop ups, adverts, marketing and sponsors.
