Important Changes from Monday 8th March

Just a reminder that timetables will revert back to the timings used in the autumn term from Monday 8th March.

Students will be back in their year group bubbles in their allocated classrooms and homebases.

Students will be expected to be in full school uniform unless they have PE that day. **On PE days** students must come to school in their PE kit as before Christmas. You will be doing practical PE in the sports hall (no boots needed).

EARLY CLOSURE OF SCHOOL ON THURSDAY 11TH MARCH

School/College will close at **1:50pm** for Year 9, and **2.00pm** for Years 10, 11, 12 and 13 on Thursday 11th March as the Year 8 Student Progress Evening begins at 2:30pm.

Years 7 and 8 will have no remote learning lesson for period 5 on this day.

Home Test Kits

Pupils will receive their home test kits from school on Friday 12th March. <u>These tests are only for students, not for other members of their household.</u>

However, other members of the student's household, childcare bubble or support bubble can also get a twice-weekly test:

- through your employer if they offer testing to employees
- at a local test site

- by collecting a home test kit from a test site
- by ordering a home test kit online

Household members can collect 2 packs each containing 7 tests from a local collection point. Anyone aged 18 or over can collect. Most collection points are open from 1.30pm to 7.00pm. You can check online if the location is open or busy before you go. You do not need to make an appointment.

Do not visit a collection point outside opening hours, as it may be used to test people with coronavirus symptoms outside these times.

If you cannot get tested at your workplace, or are unable to go to a test site or collect test kits, you can order a home test kit online. Do not order online if you can get a test through other methods. This frees up home delivery for those who need it most: https://www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests
