Dear Parent/Carer,

As we prepare to begin the Easter break, I'd like to thank all of you for everything you have done to support your child/children and our school this term.

In a world that is arguably increasingly divided and intolerant, we take pride in teaching our students to always communicate their points of view sensitively and lawfully.

As I have walked along the corridor past the English Department classrooms this week I have observed some of our Year 10 students giving talks to their peers about topics of their own choice. This activity, which is part of the GCSE English course, enables students to develop their communication skills, by speaking to a small audience of classmates, projecting their voices, explaining the material with appropriate language and information and making eye contact. Students also answer questions. It has been pleasing to hear the many rounds of applause after each talk from the student audiences who have been entertained and informed about a wide range of topics.

Today we say farewell to our colleague from Science, Miss Littlewood. She joined the School back in 2019, having trained with us. It has been wonderful to see Miss Littlewood develop into an excellent teacher and form tutor, who is highly-regarded by students and colleagues. Miss Littlewood is sadly leaving us to move abroad with her family. We wish her every success and happiness in the future. She has told us that she would like to return to HLS in the future and we all hope that she does!

Shoes and Boots- A Reminder of Our Expectations

Flat-heeled, plain, black leather or leather-look shoes. Plain, ankle-height, black leather or leather-look boots. Shoes and boots should be worn with trousers covering ankles and have only black laces.

Unacceptable items include: trainers (including plain, black trainers that look like shoes and other leisure trainers), high-heels, shoes with coloured sections. Suede. Pumps. Canvas. Boots above ankle-height, particularly military-style, construction worker-type, Dr Martens etc. Coloured or multi-coloured laces. Students show are wearing unacceptable footwear will be expected to wear shoes provided by the School until they have the correct ones.
