## Dear Parent/Carer,



It has been a bit of a strange couple of days for me to end this week as governors have been choosing my successor! It has been a pleasure to welcome the candidates to our school and introduce them to the students, staff and governors. I have told the applicants what a pleasure and privilege it has been to be Headteacher of this wonderful school and what a special place it is to work, with such fantastic students, superb staff and supportive parents and carers.

Our governors have ensured that the selection process has been incredibly thorough, with candidates taking part in a wide range of activities: presenting an assembly; student progress data analysis; finance analysis; a roleplay exercise; an interview with students; interviews with governors (including parent governors), senior leaders and middle leaders on a wide range of subjects; informally meeting students on the playground at lunchtime; a presentation to staff followed by questions and a further presentation on their vision for Higham Lane and their strategy for achieving this, followed by further questions. The process ends with a lengthy final interview. It is a challenging couple of days, just as it should be for such an important role.

Several students and staff have kindly asked me how I am feeling at this time. I have replied that I am fine and very relaxed as I don't have to take part in any of the aforementioned activities! Governors did draw on my experience to help with the design of the selection process though, which I was very happy to offer. David Buckle, our Chair of Governors, will inform students, parents/carers and staff of the outcome as soon as possible.

I know we are all deeply-shocked when we watch the reports from Ukraine each day. As a 57-year-old, I find myself in disbelief at times when I contemplate what is happening in a place not too far from the UK. (And I remember feeling anxious about the Cold War at times in my early teens and 9-11 in my mid-thirties). I then consider what it must be like for our young people as they try to make sense of what is happening in Ukraine. I want to reassure you that we will continue to work hard as a school to educate our students about what is taking place, but also to try to keep them calm and reassure them as best we can. One thing that really helps at such times is the feeling that we can try to assist those in most need. We were absolutely overwhelmed by the generosity of our families and staff in the donations you kindly sent in for the refugees from Ukraine. These were carefully sorted into categories and our Estates Team took great pleasure in delivering them to the distribution centre in Hinckley. Hopefully you will have seen our messages and photos on social media about this. So, once again, Higham Lane students, families and staff are making a difference and supporting others. Thank you.

I sometimes end these pieces with reference to my beloved football team. Perhaps that is not such a good idea at the moment. A couple of students have asked me whether I will be making a bid to buy Chelsea FC. I have pointed out that I am not quite in that league, but perhaps I could put in a joint bid with our former Assistant Headteacher, and fellow Chelsea fan, Mr Evans.

I hope you have a pleasant weekend and some quality time with your family and friends and the rugby union fans amongst you get the results you are looking for.

## Year 8 - Options Deadline - Reminder

The Year 8 Options forms went live on Tuesday 8th March. The deadline for returning the form is Monday 14th March (end of the day).

## Year 8 HPV 1 Vaccinations

These will take place on Wednesday 13th July 2022 and Thursday 14th July 2022.

**Year 9 - HPV 2 Vaccinations.** These will take place on Monday 11th July 2022 and Tuesday 12th July 2022.

**Year 11** - Last week we launched revision strategy sessions during form time for our year 11 students. Each student was provided with their own copy of How to Revise for GCSE: Study Skills & Planner – CGP book to aid their exam preparation. This includes a link inside the front cover to gain access to online resources. The students are participating in activities lead by their form tutor on Mindmaps, flow charts, Memory techniques, revision cards, topic checklists, revision timetables and 'Eat, sleep, stay well'. This gives them a chance to revisit strategies, plan their time, manage their stress and feel confident and prepared.

Once all the sessions have been completed, they will be able to bring their book home and use it in the run up to their final examinations. They will also be able to revisit the sessions and activities via their year 11 Google classroom account.

## Year 10 and 12 - Step by Step Guide to Finding a Work Experience Placement:

### A Step by Step Guide – Students & Parents

1. <https://www.highamlaneschool.co.uk/workexperience>
2. Watch the Power Point Presentation & read through the Parent Information Booklet
3. Find your own Work Experience Placement – use all possible networks. Support available from Mrs Mitchell
4. Complete the Work Experience Placement Form & return it to Mrs Mitchell at school by Friday 1<sup>st</sup> April. Complete & submit online or print off & return to Mrs Mitchell
5. Complete an EV4 form & return to Mrs Mitchell by Friday 1<sup>st</sup> April. This form is on the school website for you to download & complete or ask your child to get one from Student Services

Once your forms have been sent into school, **Mrs Mitchell will then contact your employers and send them all the relevant information they need. You do not need to do anything else.**

Health & Safety checks will be completed by school within a 35mile radius of the school free of charge.

If your placement is over 35miles away, checks will be completed by an external company and the cost of this will be passed onto parents/carers. If you are receipt of pupil Premium, a contribution of £30 will go towards this from school and you will need to pay the rest yourself.
