Dear Parent/Carer,

It was excellent last Friday evening to pay tribute to our class of 2021, the Year 11s who completed their GCSEs last year, with our first-ever Virtual Prize Giving Evening. We were delighted to have some very special celebrities announcing award winners, including several former Higham Lane students such as Hasnain Khan, a trainee Medical student who was awarded the British Empire Medal for services during the pandemic and Charlotte Bailey who won Dragon's Den with her partner and has set up Rheal Superfoods. We've now shared the video link with all of our year groups' parents/carers as we had such a positive response to it and thought you would like to see it. The real stars of the show though were all of the students in that year group, whether they won awards or not. They did so well in coping with the whole Covid situation and remaining focused and enthusiastic. We are so proud of them.

This week, Assistant Headteacher, Mr Naisbitt has been talking to the students in special assemblies about making the right choices when it comes to behaviour and uniform, personal appearance and following the school's rules. He has reminded students of our expectations as a school and of the benefits of doing the right thing. The students listened really well. The overwhelming majority of our students make the right choices every day and impress us so much.

Our Covid-19 figures as a school remain quite low for students and staff. This is pleasing and gives us confidence that we are managing things well. On Wednesday evening, the government informed us that students would not have to wear face coverings in lessons from Thursday, 20th January and this would apply to all other communal areas from Thursday, 27th January. This is as a result of the situation improving nationally in terms of a fall in the number of people testing positive for Covid. The only exception to this will be if Public Health become worried about the Covid figures in the school and/or local area. The news of students and staff not having to wear face coverings in school will be welcomed by most people I imagine. We will continue to apply other health and safety measures in school, such as the regular washing of hands with hand sanitiser. We are hoping we can run the School as normal for the time-being with typical school activities such as assemblies and our many extra-curricular activities.

You will have seen the slight change in the guidance regarding Lateral Flow Tests (LFTs) last week, meaning that a positive LFT means that a PCR test does not need to be taken to confirm – you must simply isolate for the allotted period of time. Accordingly, it is vital that students are taking their two LFTs each week, so that we can do our best to support staff and students in the school.

Year 10 students begin two weeks of trial exams next Monday. These opportunities to practise their skills and test their knowledge are so important, particularly after the time we have lost because of the pandemic. We wish them well and know they will revise hard and fully prepare, so the exams are a genuine test of what they know.

Recently we advertised for some new Parent Governors and I was delighted with the response. It was wonderful to welcome these colleagues to our virtual Full Governors meeting back in December and they are attending their first sub-committee meetings this term. At Higham, we have a diverse, inclusive, friendly governing body who work hard to help our school continue to improve and celebrate our successes.

I hope you have an enjoyable weekend with your family. I am hoping that Chelsea's form improves but not holding my breath. At least I won't have to watch the English cricket team losing to the Aussies anymore!


