Dear Parent/Carer,



I know we are in all shock at the horrific events in Ukraine. At times like this, schools have a very important role to play. I was enormously grateful to Mr Ireland and Mrs Doyne-Ditmas for putting together an assembly at great speed on this topic, clearly explaining the background to our students, but also trying to calm them at what is inevitably a very worrying time. I am delighted that we will be collecting key items to send to the refugees from the conflict next week.

It was lovely to be able to welcome Year 11 students from our local area and their parents/carers into school for our Sixth Form Open Evening on Thursday. We have not been able to hold such important events for some time because of the pandemic. It was an excellent evening with a superb input from a wide range of universities and a fantastic contribution from staff and students. A local charity 'Feed the Hungry' is collecting donations of goods to help refugees from Ukraine. The charity has already taken over 40 tons of food to the Czech Republic which will be transported to two warehouses, one in Poland and one in Romania and distributed out to centres and community groups helping refugees. It is also sending funds to groups and churches who have kitchen facilities to pack food boxes or provide shelter and hot food in Izmail in Southern Ukraine.

The charity is currently collating a shipment of:

- Clothing - women's and children's
- Sleeping bags and blankets
- Hygiene/toiletries and nappies
- Dry food - rice noodles and pasta
- Snacks and biscuits
- Travel mugs and water bottles
- Tea, coffee, sugar and dry milk

If you wish to donate any of these items, please send them into school with your son/daughter on **Monday 7th March only**. Your son/daughter will need to drop them off at **Coombe Hall** at **registration time**.

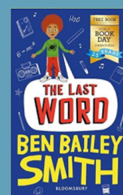
