I had the privilege of attending a presentation earlier this week at Ambleside Sports Club by an external speaker, Graham Chatterley, focusing on the importance of staff using emotion coaching to support students who have experienced past trauma. At Higham Lane School at the start of the current academic year in September, all our staff received comprehensive Trauma-Informed Attachment Awareness Schools (TIAAS) training and on Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs); this training ensures our staff are even better equipped to support our most vulnerable students. The recent presentation reinforced the vital work we are doing in this area and confirmed that we are very much on the right track.
